## Consultation on the Amendments to NZQA Rules to align with the Reforms of Vocational Education (RoVE)

We are pleased to provide comment to the NZQA on the amendments to NZQA Rules.

### **General Comments**

While we understand the new world of RoVE and the role of workforce development councils, we consider that as a PTE offering a suite of programmes leading into undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate programmes the changes to Rules 4.1, 5.1 and 13 that will require us to seek WDC endorsement of our undergraduate programmes is adding another layer of compliance when developing and seeking approval from NZQA.

We currently consult widely with the early childhood profession and secure appropriate support and evidence when we develop new programmes. To now include us in the mix with a WDC adds an additional step in the process of programme approval and current programme moderation/monitoring reviews and reapprovals.

We note that the Education and Training Bill spells out the functions of a WDC. We hope that WDC endorsements won't be unreasonably withheld or what WDCs won't delay programmes being approved and therefore delay delivery.
