 At times it can be a challenge to make specific links between Learning Outcomes and Graduate Profile Outcomes across the diversity of programmes. For example, health and safety is covered within programme content but is not always explicit in the course learning outcomes.

- Q.5 Please provide any overall comments you have about this suite of qualifications for the review to consider, or any other relevant issues that you think are important.
 - Need to recognise the responsibility and importance of education providers provision of pathways and suites of qualifications that enable progression by learners ranging from a focus on care to a focus on education.
 - The importance of NZQA liaising with professional bodies such as Teaching Council to facilitate the progression from education qualifications to initial teacher qualifications.
 - Consideration of the name of qualifications and what they imply to the sector i.e., diplomas at level 5 which are not teaching qualifications in comparison to a Level 7 teaching diploma which then can lead to full teacher registration.
 - Because the name of the qualification often differs from the name of the programme, this presents challenges when marketing the qualification and programme and means an adjustment for providers.
 - Concern about the timing of this review given the current COVID-19 environment and education providers and ECE services trying to re-open and work through the myriad of challenges under Alert level 3.
